New Faculty and Guests for Spring 2007



Velli-Mati Karkkainen is one of the world's leading theologians. He is the author of 10 books in English, as well as 7 more in Finnish. Professor of Systematic Theology at Fuller Theological Seminary, Pasadena, California, he also serves as Privatdozent of Ecumenism at the University of Helsinki. His latest titles include "One with God: Salvation as Deification and Justification" and "Trinity and Religious Pluralism." Dr. Karkkainen (pronounced KAR-kai-nen) has extensive experience as a Pentecostal missionary in Thailand and in other countries. He will be teaching **MHTM/THEM 639/PTHM640 Sp. Studies: Theology of Religions**, using his own magisterial book, *An Introduction to the Theology of Religions: Biblical, Historical & Contemporary Perspectives* (IVP).



Mervin Van der Spuy (ThD in Counseling, University of South Africa) is Chair of the Counseling Department at Providence Theological Seminary in Otterburne, Manitoba, Canada. A native of South Africa and a minister of the Apostolic Faith Mission, Dr. Van de Spuy (pronounced van-der-SPAY) is a theologian, a licensed counselor and a pharmacist. He will be teaching **PCPM 643 Sp. Stu.: Introduction to Psychopharmacology**. This course will be very valuable to future professional counselors as well as alumni who may wish to take the course as continuing education.



Manuel Cordero (DMin in Ministry to Marriage and Family, Palmer Theological Seminary) is an A/G chaplain and AGTS alumnus, retired after 31 years of service in correctional ministries (23 years with the Federal Bureau of Prisons). He currently serves as Correctional Ministries Representative for the Assemblies of God. Immediately after the tragic 9/11 attacks in New York, Dr. Cordero led a team of 20 chaplains and psychologists who ministered at the site of the World Trade Center. He will teach **PTHM 656 Ministry in Trauma, Crisis, and Grief Contexts**, a course specifically designed for chaplain candidates, but open to other students.
