Ten articles from academic journals related to the research topic intended to be studied by the student. The articles should demonstrate a variety of methodologies implemented by the authors to study the topic of interest. These articles can be obtained from EBSCO or another online source.

Three dissertations that address the student's general area of interest: a critical review of each. Note, if the student is a PhD student, these must be doctoral dissertations, not DMiss or DMin projects.

Course Requirements:

1. **Attendance, reading preparation, and participation.**
2. Critical review of three dissertations/projects
3. Reflection paper
4. Three SAGE books reviews on Methodology and Trial run
5. VAW Synopsis
6. A **prospectus for the dissertation**, a maximum of 21-29 pages long, in the appropriate style, format, and grammar.
