Course Requirements:

1. **Pre-Session / Reading Assignments:** Fulfill the required reading (For undergraduate and MA's) in its entirety and write a one-page report for each of the six textbooks. One paragraph identifying something you agreed with, one paragraph identifying something you disagreed with, and one paragraph articulating something you will adopt, change, or practically begin. PhD students must do the above and a one-page report on the same terms for the PhD additional reading texts. **Reading reports due by July 11, 2021.**
2. **In-Session:**
 - Attend all class sessions and be prepared to participate in discussion and group activity.
 - One page (Undergraduate and MA students) of journaling (A4, typed 12 point, single spaced) must be submitted for each day. These journal entries should include a summary of what was gleaned from all input from each days class session from prayer, to lectures, media, guests et al. PhD. students must submit 2 pages per day.
 - **Daily Summaries due by midnight of each class day.**
3. **Post-Session:** Church Planting Plans of a) Reverse Engineering, b) 4 Fields. Two PowerPoint presentations each of at least 10 slides that lay out a Church Planting plan according to a) Reverse Engineering grid and b) the 4 Fields grid.
