CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

Selected readings from various genre of the Greek New Testament (GNT) and other Hellenistic writings with attention to building vocabulary and expanding understanding of syntax. Translation and exegetical procedures help students develop a theological understanding of Scripture.

COURSE PREREQUISITES:

Prerequisite: BGR 530 Greek 1a and 531 Greek 1b or equivalent

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Bring your Greek NT to every class. We will **sight-read/translate in class** without aids.
2. Complete all **syntax worksheet** assignments before class. The worksheets will be included in the full syllabus.
3. Participate in **class discussions** on exegetical outlines/structure diagrams, translation and syntactical analysis of the assigned passages from Colossians and First Thessalonians.
4. Punctually **attend** class (*Student Handbook* applies). Every class counts.
5. Compile a neat, well-organized **course notebook** that contains all completed course assignments: translations, syntax worksheets, class notes, and pertinent handouts. Graded at mid-term and final exams.
6. Complete **vocabulary quizzes** from Colossians and First Thessalonians.
7. Complete the **Mid-Term Exam** (over Colossians) and **Final Exam** (over 1Thess.).
