Course Requirements:

This is the capstone academic experience for the degree of Master of Arts in Theological Studies and functions as the final assessment tool for the degree. This course is designed to guide and assist the student in preparing a major seminar paper (about a third the size of a thesis—35 pages—but functioning much like one). The required research, interpretation, and writing provide the opportunity to demonstrate competency within the chosen concentration of study. The students will critique each other's work before the final submission.
