Personal choice of a Missionary Biography

Course Requirements/Assignments:

1. **Attendance, and class participation**
2. **Reading Assignments:** Students must read the assigned textbooks according to the class schedule. A Canvas online open book "Quiz" must be completed for each text and for a missionary biography.
1. **Reflection Cycle:** Utilizing the "Model for Ministry Reflection" examine a ministry leadership event in your own life and articulate a contextual theology which addresses the event (i.e., articulate the "mind of Christ" for the ministry event). (7-10 pp.). This reflection will be collected via an online assignment in Course Commons. **The Reflection Cycle assignment comprises 25% of your overall grade. Due April 8.**
2. **Comprehensive Exam:** Based on class notes and the assigned reading, articulate a Pentecostal theology of leadership development which includes an examination of the spiritual and corporate disciplines, organizational structures, the indigenous church, call and empowerment, the role of the local church and Pentecostal distinctives, include a personal reflection on your own call, empowerment, and leadership experience- past, present and future. (7-10 pp.)" **Research paper assignment comprises 40% of your overall grade. Due April 22.**

Details on the requirements and an extended bibliography will be a part of the syllabus, which will be available a week prior to class through course commons.
